

NOTES OF EXECUTIVE MEETING
WELLINGTON, NZ
30 JANUARY 1996

A meeting of the Executive of the ANZ Society of Criminology was held during the Annual Conference of the Society in Wellington NZ.

Present were:

State Representatives:

The following matters were discussed:

- the need for Marg Darcy, erstwhile Treasurer, to transfer her files to Ms Carpenter as soon as possible. Arie Freiberg agreed to pursue the matter with Marg Darcy;
- the need for the Secretary to obtain and maintain an up to date membership list;
- the need for greater communication between members of the Executive, and with members of the Society as to what is happening within the Society;
- the need to issue a calendar of relevant dates to members of the executive;
- the date of the next conference to be held in Brisbane on July 8 - 11, 1997 to be convened by Giffith University;
- the need for a list of state representatives and their addresses: this will be prepared by Gayre Christie;
- the need for regular tele-conferences between executive members;
- it was agreed to accede to Butterworths' request to raise the price of the journal to \$85;
- it was agreed to raise the membership fee to \$95 pa in view of the increase in the cost of the journal;
- Arie Freiberg agreed to explore the possibility of institutional membership for a range of organisations as a means of expanding its funding base;
- moved a motion of support for the decision of the convenor of the Conference to proceed with the published programme in the face of certain threats by the government of South Australia against the authors of papers relating to events in South Australia;
- noted that the Executive was required to meet three times per year (March, July and September). It was agreed that this meeting could qualify for the first meeting of the year;
- noted that the AGM should be held no later than September 1996;
- noted the need to re-negotiate the contract with Butterworths.
