This year the ANZSOC Postgraduate and Early Career Researcher Conferences will be held at the Hotel Grand Chancellor on Tuesday 29 November 2016. Postgraduate students and ECRs are invited to present a paper, submit a poster, or simply attend and participate in the workshops and networking events that are being held throughout the day. **There is no registration fee.**

Three workshop sessions will be held, workshop themes include:

- ❖ AT (After Thesis): Post-Thesis and Early Career Employment

Alongside the short (5 minute) research paper presentations held in Session 2 and the workshop sessions, the day will be broken-up with many opportunities to mingle and network with your peers at morning tea, lunch, afternoon tea, and at the post-conference dinner at La Porchetta in Salamanca which is within a short walking distance from the conference (dinner not included).
